4-H YOUTH ACTIVITIES

4-H Youth programs are non-formal, voluntary educational programs under the supervision of the Cooperative Extension Service of the University of California and the United States Department of Agriculture. They are part of Extension Teaching. The projects exhibited at the Fair by members are the results of their efforts under the supervision of adult volunteers. Youths may enroll on their 9th birthday or upon entering the 4th grade, and may be members until the end of the calendar year in which they become 19. Experimental and special programs may disregard these age limits.

County, District and State Fairs cannot legally carry liability insurance covering junior exhibitors and/or their exhibits. Liability insurance is the responsibility, and at the discretion, of the junior exhibitor. Therefore it is suggested that the junior exhibitors consider taking out a liability insurance policy covering themselves and their exhibits. The Antelope Valley Fair cannot accept liability for loss and/or damage to any exhibit. All 4-H Clubs will be required to work in the 4-H/Grange area before, during and after the fair; for times call Jessie 816-17. The local uniform should be worn by all 4-H exhibitors and by helpers in sections for individual animals or club groups. The uniform is white trousers, white dress shirt, regulation hat, tie or scarf, and matching belt and shoes (brown shoes and brown belt etc.). Belts should be worn if the pants have belt loops. To exhibit at the Antelope Valley Fair, a 4-H youth must be 9 years old by January 1st of the current year. They must be enrolled in the projects in which they plan to exhibit by January 1st. All exhibits must be marked with the age and year in the project as of January 1st in order to be judged. Exhibits must be ready for display at check-in. Guidelines for entering divisions: Beginning 1st & 2nd years, Intermediate - 3rd & 4th years and Advanced - 5th year & above. State Rules and Health Regulations applicable to the Senior Department apply also to the Junior Department. NO MEMBER MAY BE ON THE GROUNDS AFTER THE FAIR HAS CLOSED. All exhibits entering in 4-H may be brought to the Youth building during placement hours only.

4-H YOUTH EXHIBITORS INSTRUCTIONS:

All entries in the following divisions must have been made, collected, grown or prepared entirely by the exhibitors, who were enrolled in those projects in the 4-H Youth Program, within one year of the opening day of the Fair. Must be done in accordance with directions and recipes in project manuals and outlines. Check carefully for the recommended kind and size of container, and method of labeling. Only standard containers, specifically designed for the purpose, will be accepted. Age and year in project must be on entry form and on item entered.

NOTE TO EXHIBITORS: No exhibits will be returned without a claim check.

EXHIBITS WILL NOT BE REMOVED FROM THE FAIRGROUNDS BEFORE THE RELEASE DATE PRINTED IN THE PREMIUM BOOK.

Exhibits not removed during the designated hours will be taken to the 4-H Office, located in the Cooperative Extension Office, 335 E. Ave K-10 Lancaster, CA 93535. Except for decorated cakes, and food items which will be disposed. NOTE TO JUDGES: Best of Show medals should be based on overall excellence and accomplishment of the exhibitor's total display. Difficulty, excellence and originality shall be favored over quantity of classes completed.

JUDGING SCALE AND ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: The Danish System of judging is based upon established standards of quality for each type of product. In this system each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets the standard rather than how it compares to other exhibits. In all Junior Departments using the Danish System, the following judging scale shall be used by all judges:

Danish System of Judging

RULES:

1. Exhibitors may enter only ONE DIVISION in this section. Beginning Intermediate or Advanced.
2. Age as of January 1, year in project and club must appear on entry form and exhibits. Attach a tag to the exhibits with only the following information: Age as of January 1, year in project, club, and any special information, such as first year in ceramics but fourth year in crafts.
3. Paintings must be framed. If not framed the entry will not be accepted. All paintings and other large framed items (stained glass or mosaics, etc.) must be complete with screw eye and wire hangers. All other exhibits intended to be hung must have appropriate hangers. Due to the type of hooks used on a pegboard, sawtooth hangers are not acceptable. PAPER FRAMES & MATS NOT ACCEPTABLE FOR HANGING.
4. If member is entering an item that is pre-cut or pre-stamped, the member will securely attach a note stating which portion of the item they completed.
5. NO LIVE PLANTS may be used in display and no cut flowers.
6. All needlework backs (pillow, pictures etc.) MUST BE LEFT OPEN for judging.
7. Exhibits must be clean and ready for display when checked in.
8. Ceramics must be earthenware and kiln fired. Ceramics intended to be hung must have appropriate hangers. Special circumstances (i.e. hand thrown, etc.) should be tagged with this information.
9. HANDICRAFTS OTHER Class includes Arts & Crafts that do not fit in any other area. Excludes all Holiday Arts & Crafts.
10. HOLIDAY includes Holiday item. Member has choice of entering in Holiday or any other suitable class.
11. All entries are to be made by the exhibitor enrolled in the current 4-H year in the project they are entering. No school projects. Entries are to be made during the current 4-H year.
12. Creative writing entries must be framed, or mounted in a way they can be displayed. In folders, notebooks, on poster board or frames.
13. Recycled Art entries must have a tag attached explaining what it was, what it is now, and how it was recycled, only the above information should be on the tag. A recycled item is something that would have been discarded and has been recycled into a useful item. 90% of the recycled art entry must be made of recycled material.
14. Exhibit will be judged on the neatness and artistry of the exhibit.

NOTES:

1. Members should select articles to do within their ability.
2. Suggestion for creative writing: poems, personal experience, humorous, sonnet, calligraphy, short stories, fewer than six pages.

3. Each exhibit to be listed separately and identified by type (i.e. blouse, skirt, etc.) on entry form. Cannot use same material, pattern and/or style for more than one exhibit
4. Pattern instruction sheet must accompany the garment. Any changes in construction of items must be noted and tagged on exhibit.
5. Each garment is to be brought in on a WIRE HANGER. It must have a tag with extra information as needed.

1. Exhibitor may enter ONE DIVISION in this section. Each exhibit may be entered in only one class/division. Any exhibit entered in the wrong division will be subject to point loss.
2. Age as of January 1st, year in project, and club must appear on entry form and exhibit. Age, year in project and club must be on the back of exhibit.
3. Each exhibit to be listed separately by name on entry form.
4. All entries must be mounted on poster board. EACH ENTRY MUST BE MOUNTED SEPARATELY. The poster board is not to be more than two inches larger than the project. Failure to follow this rule will result in immediate disqualification of the entry.
5. For Class 1, a printout of the source code and program on disk must be supplied. For Class 6, include a printout of one of the pages, mounted with a holder for a disk, and a copy of the presentation disk.
6. All entries must be changed/edited or created by the exhibitor, more than changing a word or a graphic. Entry will be disqualified for failure to follow this rule.
7. All entries must list the software used, how they were used and the steps taken while making the entry. This must be listed on a separate piece of paper mounted on the front of the poster board with the final product. DO NOT PUT YOUR NAME OR AGE ON THIS. Points will be deducted for failure to follow this rule.
8. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE FULLY COMPUTER GENERATED.
9. No school projects, reports, etc. are to be entered. Only work done as part of the 4-H computer project is acceptable. Failure to follow this rule will result in immediate disqualification of the entry.
10. For group entries, the name of the group is to be used on the information part of the entry form as well as on the exhibit. A group entry cannot be entered as an individual. FAILURE TO FOLLOW THE ABOVE RULES WILL RESULT IN A LOSS OF 5% ON TOTAL SCORE.

RULES:

1. Exhibitor may enter ONE DIVISION in this section.
2. Age as of January 1, year in project, club, must be on entry form and exhibit
3. If a kit is used, this information must be indicated on entry form and exhibit.
4. Decorated Cakes and Gingerbread Houses to be delivered on a sturdy board or plate not to exceed two inches beyond the cake unless necessary to support shape of cake or part of decoration.
5. The Fair is not responsible for your baking dishes.

FAILURE TO FOLLOW THE ABOVE RULES WILL RESULT IN A 5% LOSS ON TOTAL SCORE.

NOTE: Exhibit cake to be judged entirely on decoration. A "real cake" is not necessary to use as a form for decoration. The cakes may be of a mix, styrofoam, cardboard, or other substance, providing the shape is one which could reasonably be achieved through baking. Decoration must be done as though the cake would actually be eaten. Real frosting, candies, etc. must be used. Royal icing is acceptable for use in flowers and decorations.

Danish System of Judging

RULES:

1. Exhibitor may enter ONE DIVISION in this section.
2. Age as of January 1st, year in project, and club must be on entry form.
3. Each exhibit must be a different product or the same product preserved in a different method.
4. Entry form must list type of product (fruit, vegetable, preserves, etc.) and the method or process used (canning or drying). No cookie or drink mixes.
5. Age as of January 1st, club, year in Food Preservation Project, and method used must be on the bottom of all jars. Kind of product to be on front of jar only. This must be done at home. We will not supply paper and tape on entry day.
6. Decorated jars will not be accepted.
7. Rings and lids must be on jars to be accepted (not plastic wrap or paraffin wax). All canning must be in sealed jars or they will be disqualified.
8. Low acid foods must be canned under pressure.
9. TWO JARS PER EXHIBIT (except dried products) will be required for judging, and one may be opened for taste judging.
10. Jars which have been opened must be picked up after judging is completed, or they will be disposed of. No exceptions to this rule.
11. Dried products should be in jars with lids and seals. Each dried product must be in a separate covered jar, which must be at least half full.
