American System of Judging

For guidance of the exhibitor, the following Guidelines are factors which the judges usually consider in placing awards:

1. Condition of product, free from insects, injury, blemishes, disease
2. Quality of the product - firm, tender, crisp, fresh
3. Form - typical of variety, uniform
4. Size - desired by commercial use
5. Husband and wife are considered 1 exhibitor (see State Rules)
6. The Fair will provide plates for fruit and vegetables displays
