American System of Judging

(State Rule IV #6a, c)

RULES:

1. Fleeces shall not be more than 12 months' growth. The definition of "12 months" shall be the definition commonly accepted by the wool trade; thus, if fleece is actually slightly more than 12 months' growth due to unavoidable delay in obtaining shears, or by weather, it shall be termed "12 month" wool.
2. The exhibitor showing the fleece must be the primary care provider and/or trainer of the animal that provided the fleece. The youth does not have to own the animal to show the fleece, but they must own the fleece.
3. It is recommended the animal be cleaned before shearing and the shearing be completed on a clean surface such as a tarp to prevent contamination.
4. Shampoo, cream rinse or other chemical residue shall not be applied prior to or after shearing. Residue of grooming product will cause disqualification of fleece.
5. Fleece should be appropriately clean. It MUST NOT be washed after shearing. Washing a shorn fleece will be cause for disqualification.
6. Fleece must be completely dry and free of molds and mildew when entered.
7. The fleece may be skirted. (ie leg, neck, belly wool removed from fleece) Only prime fiber needs to be entered.
8. A picture of the animal (before or after shearing) must be submitted. This picture may be used to help with wool classification.
9. Additional pictures of the exhibitor with the animal before and after shearing would be appreciated. These pictures will be used as part of the wool display and will not be seen by the judge prior to judging. Pictures may be submitted in digital format which is preferred.
10. A card with the following information will be completed and displayed by the exhibitor and displayed with each fleece. If exact dates are not known be as accurate as possible.

4. Huacaya dark wool (fleece sheared from animal at 25 months and above)
5. Huacaya combination colors (fleece sheared from animal at 24 months and under)
6. Huacaya combination colors (fleece sheared from animal at 25 months and above)
7. Suri Alpaca light wool (fleece sheared from animal at 24 months and under)
8. Suri Alpaca light wool (fleece sheared from animal at 25 months and above)
9. Suri Alpaca dark wool (fleece sheared from animal at 24 months and under)
10. Suri Alpaca dark wool (fleece sheared from animal at 25 months and above)
11. Suri Alpaca combination colors (fleece sheared from animal at 24 months and under)
12. Suri Alpaca combination colors (fleece sheared from animal at 25 months and above)

DIVISION 4 Wool Fiber Art

Rules: Must use wool fiber from animals the youth exhibitor helped to raise. A card must be included noting the different materials used and each animal the wool came from. Fiber may be natural or dyed. Item must be constructed by the youth exhibitor during the project year.

1. Needle Felting – 100 % wool, all same animal - simple project
2. Needle Felting – 100 % wool, all same animal - complex project
3. Needle Felting – 100 % wool, combination of animals (all sheep or all llama is OK) – simple project
4. Needle Felting – 100 % wool, combination of animals (all sheep or all llama is OK) – complex project
5. Needle Felting – Combination of manmade and natural wool fibers. – simple project
6. Needle Felting – Combination of manmade and natural wool fibers. – complex project
7. Wet felting – simple project
8. Wet felting – complex project
9. Other Art - using 100% wool fiber – simple project
10. Other Art – using 100% wool fiber – complex project
11. Other art – using a combination of manmade and natural wool fibers – complex project.
