Floriculture exhibits are displayed in the Farm & Garden Building. Exhibits in the Floriculture Department must have been grown by the exhibitor within the area defined in Local Rule #7, except divisions for arrangements.

ARTISTIC DESIGN RULES:

1. Accessories or decorative foliage is permitted in the arrangement and will be furnished by the exhibitor. Accessories may not be placed around the arrangement. Every reasonable precaution will be taken to assure the safe return of these items; however, no responsibility is assumed for loss or damage. See Local Rule #1.
2. Accessories and vases should be marked with the name of the owner, but markings must not show when accessories are in place in the display.
3. All arrangements must be assembled by the exhibitor, not to exceed 24" square, no height restriction. Special size requirements for miniatures listed below or noted in description.
4. The use of artificial or dried flowers or foliage, tissue, or crepe paper will not be permitted except in dry flower arrangements where dry flowers are required.

OPEN DRY ARRANGEMENT

CLASS:

1. Victorian – arrangements appropriate to or depicting the Victorian Era
2. Woodland Wonder - using wood or other material as the container
3. Western - miniature arrangement, not to exceed 5in in any direction
4. Early American - using old implements from the past. 15in x 24in in size
5. Beach Party - anything from the sea, not to exceed 15in x 24in

6. Teatime – Using a Tea Pot or Teacup as a container

- New Rule:** 1. Please Identify plant name to best of ability on Entry Form (i.e. Crown of Thorns, hanging Airplane plant)
2. Potted and hanging plants must be owned by the exhibitor at least 60 days prior to the opening day of the Fair.
 3. Exhibits should be suitably groomed for exhibit and where appropriate, leaves may be moderately polished.
 4. Potted plants must have suitable containers. Any questions, call Chairperson.
 5. Hanging plants must be ready for hanging. However, plants will be hung based on space available.
 6. Exhibitor must be responsible for loading, unloading and placing exhibit. ADA and special assistance given by request.
