### GENERAL RULES

1. Age as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, to determine Division to enter
2. Items to be hung must be ready to hang.
3. Entries must be created during current year.

**4. There will be no changes after the entry deadline.**

**5. All Items are judged by the Danish System of Judging.**

### GRANGE ARTS & CRAFTS

Limit: Two (2) entries per class per exhibitor

**Danish System of Judging:**

QUALITY SCORE RIBBON: 1st - 90%-100% Blue- 2nd - 80%-89% Red - 3rd- 70%-79% White

### RULES:

1. Paintings must be ready to hang. Due to the type of hooks used on pegboard, saw-tooth hangers are not acceptable. Paper frames and mats are sufficient for hanging. **NO GLASS FRAMES!**
2. If a member is entering an item that is pre-cut or pre-stamped, the member shall attach a note stating which portion of the item they completed.
3. NO LIVE PLANTS may be used in display.
4. All needlework backs MUST BE LEFT OPEN for judging.
5. Items must be ready for display when checked in.
6. Items for exhibits must be marked with age and year in project.
7. Ceramics must be earthenware and kiln fired.
8. HANDICRAFTS include arts and crafts that do not fit in any other class.
9. Member select articles to do with their ability and will be judged on neatness and artistry of the exhibit.
10. Age to determine division to enter.
11. Exhibitors may enter only ONE DIVISION in this section

## **GRANGE FINE ART**

Limit: Two (2) entries per class per exhibitor

### **RULES:**

1. All entries must be the original work of the member.
2. Paintings must be ready to hang. Due to the type of hooks used on pegboard, saw tooth hangers are not acceptable. Paper frames and mats are sufficient for hanging. **NO GLASS FRAMES!**
3. All entries must be from current project year.
5. Any media may be used - paint, pastels, watercolor, oil, ink, pen, charcoal and mixed media.

## **GRANGE RECYCLING ART**

Limit: Two (2) entries per class per exhibitor

### **RULES:**

1. May use any combination of materials and be of any shape.
2. May use one or more tin cans, such as soup, tuna or vegetable cans, etc.
3. All entries must have appropriate label on them to be eligible for judging.
4. May use any medium to decorate (paint, yarn, paper, cloth etc.) applies to art can.

### **DIVISIONS:**

### **CLASS:**

1. Plastic - bottles.
2. Any Metal - soda cans.
3. Any Paper / Cardboard.

## **GRANGE FOOD PRESERVATION**

Limit: Two (2) entries per exhibitor

### **RULES:**

1. Entry form must list type of produce, and the method of process used (canning or drying).
2. Age and year in project must be on entry form.
3. Rings and lids must be on jars. Two jars per exhibit will be required so that one may be opened for taste judging. Dried products should be covered in jars.
4. All canning must be in sealed jars, or they will be disqualified. Jars which have been opened for judging must be picked up on day of judging or they will be disposed of.
5. Each dried product exhibit must be in a separate jar no smaller than a half pint and must be half full.
6. Fruit leather should be cut into 12 one-inch strips and rolled into cellophane between layers. Do not secure fruit leather strips with cellophane.
7. Age to determine division to enter.
8. Exhibitors may enter only ONE DIVISION in this section.

## **GRANGE TABLE SETTINGS**

Limit: One (1) entry per class per exhibitor **Received on Wednesday Sept. 20, 2 – 7pm**

### **RULES:**

1. Standard Card table will be furnished by the Exhibitor.
2. Entries will be limited to space available.
3. Exhibitors will be responsible for their own exhibit being set up and removed.
4. Exhibits shall consist of a table setting for one.
5. Menus must be furnished.
6. Serving dishes are not required.
7. Artificial flowers may be used. If fresh flowers/plants are used, they must be maintained through the Fair.
8. Emily Post etiquette, and customs of entertaining in the west will be recognized as the basic authority.

## **CLOTHING AND TEXTILES**

Limit: Two (2) entries per class per exhibitor

### **RULES:**

1. Exhibitor may enter only ONE DIVISION in this section.
2. Each exhibit to be listed separately and identified by type on entry form. Cannot use same material, pattern and/or style for more than one exhibit
3. Pattern instruction sheet must accompany the garment. Any changes in construction must be noted on the instruction sheet.
4. Age to determine division to enter.
5. Each garment is to be brought in on a WIRE HANGER.
6. COORDINATED EXHIBIT to be considered at least three garments to be worn at the same time. Hats, belts, scarves, purses, etc. will be considered part of the coordinated outfit, if made by exhibitor.

1. Coordinated/multiple wearable item Exhibit

## **GRANGE WOODWORKING**

Limit: Two (2) entries per class per exhibitor

### **RULES:**

1. Each exhibit to be listed separately and identified by name on entry form.
2. **Space dimension for display of entry must be specified on entry form.**
3. If a member is entering an item that has been pre-cut or pre-stamped the member shall attach a note stating which portion of the item they have completed.
4. Chairperson must clear woodworking entries if size may appear to be a problem in display.
