Divisions 1 and 2 will be Eligible for 1 Best of Show.

Division 3 NOT eligible for Best of Division or Best of Show.

Division 4 NOT eligible for Best of Division or Best of Show.

Committee Choice: Rosette Ribbon, All Divisions Included

Scouts name and unit # should be on back of every entry. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE SCOUT MADE

RULES FOR DIVISION 1 and 2:

1. One entry per Scout; per class. Only 1 division eligible, based on grade for 2025-2026 scout year
2. Scouts MUST adhere to the Guide to safe scouting and only use the appropriate tools under supervision.
3. No previously submitted entries will be accepted.

DIVISION 1- Jr Level (Grades TK-5 for the 2025-2026 school year)

Scout Individual – Jr Level (Grades TK–5) One entry per person per class.

CLASS:

1. Soap Carving or Etching. Theme: “PIG-ture Perfect” – Projects may use pre-made soap or handmade soap. Projects should be no larger than 6in x 6in carved or etched with encouragement to safely use tools that are age appropriate. SCOUTS MUST HAVE WHITTILING CHIT TO USE A POCKET KNIFE! If scout has not earned Whittling chip, please use other tools such as wooden skewer or the back of a plastic utensil.
2. Recycled portraits – Portraits should be no bigger than 8.5”x 11” using only recycled materials or materials from nature.
3. Pinewood Derby Car – should have 4 moveable wheels, kit may be used as a starting point. Preferably the car used at this year’s derby race, not required.
4. S.W.A.P.S. Board – A minimum of 5 S.W.A.P.S attached to a board no larger than 10 inches by 10 inches.

DIVISION 2- Sr Level (Grades 6-12 for the 2025- 2026 school year)

Scout Individual – One entry per person per class.

CLASS:

1. Wood Carving/ Etching/ Burning: Theme: “PIG-ture Perfect” – Projects may use any wood type desired. Can be bare, stained or painted. Projects should be no larger than 10”x10” carved or etched with encouragement to safely use tools that are age appropriate. SCOUTS MUST HAVE TOTIN’ CHIT TO USE WOOD TOOLS! If scout has not earned Totin’ chip, this is an excellent opportunity to earn it or work on woodcarving/ woodworking merit badge!
2. Recycled portraits – Portraits should be no bigger than 8.5”x 11” using only recycled materials or materials from nature.
3. Pinewood Derby Car – should have 4 moveable wheels, kit may be used as a starting point. Preferably the car used at this year’s derby race, not required.
4. S.W.A.P.S. Board – A minimum of 5 S.W.A.P.S attached to a board no larger than 10 inches by 10 inches.

DIVISION 3- Individual Higher Awards-. **AOL, Bronze, Silver, Gold, Eagle projects.**

Entry Fee, Premiums, Exhibits Received, and Exhibits Released are the same as above.

RULES FOR DIVISION 3:

1. One entry per Scout.
2. Gather photos or drawings on a mat board or poster board no larger than 22" x 28". Be sure to leave enough space on the board for a *title* and a *5"x7" card* describing your project.
3. Entries will be judged on neatness, appearance, and meaningfulness.
4. Eligible projects must have been completed during or after the 2024 Fair start date of September 25th
5. **There will be no Best of Division in this division.** Awards will be sponsored by local businesses.

DIVISION 3- Individual Higher Awards

Scout Individual – One entry

CLASS:

1. Many scouts have done amazing projects for our communities. Helping others in big and small ways is one of the best things about being in Scouts. Using photos, drawings, and words, tell us about your Higher Award Project. For AOL only, the poster can showcase the most memorable event in their scouting journey.

DIVISION 4 – Troop/Pack- Community Service Project -. **OPEN TO ALL TROOPS**

Entry Fee, Premiums, Exhibits Received, and Exhibits Released are the same as above.

RULES FOR DIVISION 4:

1. One entry per Troop.
2. Gather photos or drawings on a mat board or poster board no larger than 11" x 14". Be sure to leave enough space on the board for a *title* and a *3"x5" card* describing your project and why it is your favorite.
3. On the front of the board, include **ONLY** your Troop number, level, and city. Do not include names.
4. Entries will be judged on Neatness, appearance, and meaningfulness.
5. Eligible projects must have been completed after September 2024.
6. **There will not be a Best of Division in this division.** Awards will be sponsored by local businesses.

DIVISION 4 – Troop/Pack- Community Service Project

One Entry Per Unit

CLASS:

1. Community Service Project – Poster maximum size 11x14 inches. Requires: Title, Troop or Pack identification, pictures and captions explaining project.
