Scholarship Award: Up to \$3,000 per individual

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The application and grading system have been updated this year. High school seniors and first-year college students who are raising a market livestock animal are encouraged to apply.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be considered, applicants must meet **all** of the following requirements:

1. Be a current exhibitor in **4-H, FFA, Grange**, or an **Independent Livestock Exhibitor** (livestock department only).
 2. Raise a market livestock animal for the **2026 Antelope Valley Fair**.
 3. Submit a current copy of high school or college transcripts and maintain a **minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5**.
 4. Submit Livestock Council approved **volunteer hours**.
 5. Submit an **essay (250–500 words)** describing long-term goals and past accomplishments.
 6. Provide **two (2) character reference letters** from individuals who are not immediate family members.
 7. Scholarship recipients will be announced during the **Grand Drive** at the Antelope Valley Fair Livestock Show.
 8. Applications must be **fully completed and signed** by both the applicant and a parent/guardian.
 9. Scholarship checks will be issued after proof of enrollment in a **college or trade school** is submitted.
 10. Applications must be received **no later than Friday, March 27, 2026, at 5:00 PM** by the Antelope Valley Fair Front Office (Jennifer or Ginger). Applications may be submitted **in person or by email** to jcloud@avfair.com.

1. All applications must be **legible**.

 4. Incomplete applications will result in **point deductions** during scoring.
